

Is the Red Hill Nature Park important to you?

Red Gum-Yellow Box grassy woodland has been extensively cleared in the ACT and Australia and is now classified as endangered. Red Hill Nature Park is one of the few places where this woodland and its associated wildlife can be experienced today. Unfortunately, being close to suburban gardens, Red Hill has had a high weed invasion. In the late 1980s, weeds covered more than a third of the hill and woody weeds (such as *Pyracantha*) formed massive thickets. In 1989, the Red Hill Regenerators Group (RHRG) was formed. As part of the ACT Government's Park Care program, Red Hill Regenerators are working to restore the Red Hill woodlands.

The RHRG meets at Red Hill from 9am to 12:30pm on the fourth Sunday of each month (except for December and January), to work on bush regeneration projects. If you are interested in helping to restore the endangered bushland on Red Hill, you are welcome to join the Group and come along - once only, once a year or when it suits you. All equipment is provided and beginners are offered advice and assistance. All you need are stout shoes, clothing that protects your arms and legs, a hat, water and sunscreen.
